Bar Admission - Act by which one is licensedtopracticelawbeforecourtsofaparticulardistrictorjurisdiction after satisfying certain requirements such as bar examinations, period of residency or admission of reciprocity after period of years as member of bar of another jurisdiction.

Attorneys-At-Law - That class of persons who are by license, officers of the courts, empowered to appear, prosecute and defend, and upon whom peculiar duties, responsibilities and liabilities are developed by law as a consequence.

Attorney-In-Fact. An attorney -in-fact is simply an agent whose authority is strictly limited by the instrument appointing him, though he may do things not mentioned in his appointment necessary to the performance of the duties specifically required of him by the power of attorney appointing him, such authority being necessarily implied His authority is provided in a special power of attorney or general power of attorney. An attorney -in-fact is not necessarily a lawyer.

Counsel-de-Oficio. - A counsel, appointed or assigned by the court, from among such members of the bar in good standing who, by reason of their experience and ability, may adequately defend the accused. A Counsel -de-oficio need not be a lawyer. In localities where members of the bar are not available, the court may appoint any person, resident of the province and of good repute for probity and ability, to defend the accused.

Attorney-of-Record - Attorney whose name must appear somewhere in permanent records of files of case, or on the pleadings or some instrument filed in the case, or on an appearance docket. Person whom the client has named as his agent upon whom service of papers may be made.

Lead Counsel. - The counsel on either side of a litigated action who is charged with the principal management and direction of party's case,

as distinguished from his juniors or subordinates, is said to "lead in the cause," and is termed the "leading counsel" on the side. It may also refer to the chief or primary attorney in a class action or multidistrict litigation.

Amicus Curiae. - Literally, it means, a friend of the court. A person with strong interest in or views on the subject matter of an action, but not a party to the action, may petition the court for permission to file a brief, ostensibly on behalf of a party but actually to suggest a rationale consistent with its own views. Such amicus curiae briefs are commonly filed in appeals concerning matters of a broad public interest;

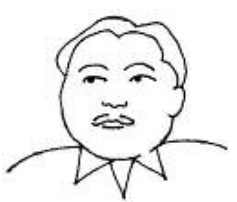

Pretty soon, they were both out of work. Or rather, they both needed to work in order to survive.

This is now, where the fourth R, 'Rotary', comes in. In our Club we have created Educational and Vocational programs and scholarships to address this problem. Book Fairs and Donations have become standard fare. We still have a lot of creative thinking and doing, if we are to help make a dent on the horrendous statistics given above. Since we have talked about 'Apple' and 'Jobs', let us also talk about Computers. I don't know the percentage of Computer Illiteracy in our country or the World, or the percentage of those who are 'Unwired', but I guess they are sky-high. We have begun to address this with our Computer Donation to the SPED School but I guess we should first remedy the Computer Illiteracy of our Members before venturing into the outside community.

So the three R's and Education are needed. However, others point out that Education without instilling Morals would just lead us to produce 'clever devils'. I can't really say for sure why some people become 'devils'. It may be a combination of 'nature' and 'nurture'. Maybe the Devil -Snake in Eden also managed to im-

PROLOGUE

Before we embark on any discussion of decided cases which may be of interest to our members, we will go on a brief review of the practice of law as a profession, the duties of a lawyer, and the disciplinary power over attorneys by the integrated bar and the Supreme Court. We may however discuss the principles involved in a case pending in the courts without trying to influence its outcome one way or another; it might be considered contempt of court which is punishable.

A dissertation on the duties of a lawyer would not be complete without a discussion of legal ethics, duties which an attorney owes to the court, to his client, to his colleagues in the profession and the public in general. These four -fold obligations of lawyers encompass the professional world of the persons in the law profession and guard against the abuses and ills of the profession such as dishonesty, immorality, sloth-

ness (laziness), lack of diligence and many other forms of malpractice of some members of the bar, and there are many.

The main source of legal ethics is the Code of Professional Responsibility, it is the compilation of various pertinent and subsisting rules of guidelines and standards on the rule of conduct of lawyers sourced from the Constitution, Rules of Court, Canons of Professional Ethics, Statutes, Special Laws, treaties and decisions of the Supreme Court which must be observed by all the members of the bar in their exercise of their profession.

Bar and Bench - Bar refers to the whole body of attorneys and counsellors; collectively, the members of the legal profession: they are figuratively called the "bar" to distinguish them from the "bench," which term denotes the whole body of judges. The members of the bar are considered officers of the court and are disci-

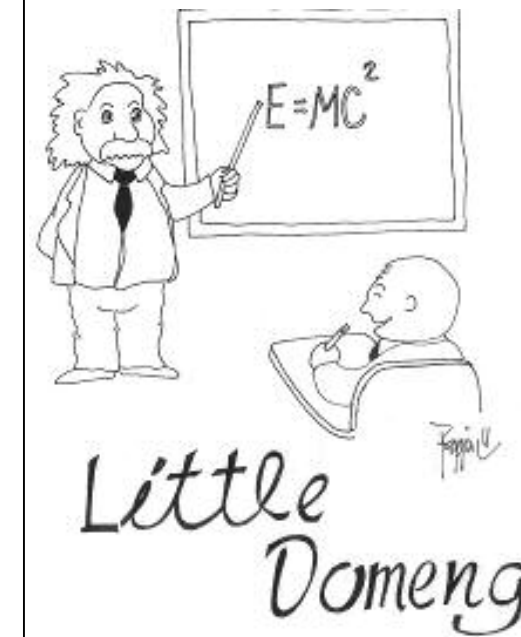
