Having said this I am suggesting to the Rotary world that we all go back to the basics. Rotary is a worldwide movement based on the desires that live in the hearts of all good people: to share and to serve. Rotary, by its very definition, attracts capable leaders who want to make the world better place. Therefore, we should let the grassroots have a bigger say. Let our clubs chart their own course. Let them set their own goals and let them fulfill their own dreams. We must respect their initiative and judgements. We must remember that each Rotary club is an autonomous entity.

Of course, this doesn't mean that in going back to the basics we should ignore the great many changes that are taking place or the many challenges that are facing us.

On the contrary, we must renew our commitment to tackle the problems of our troubled world with all of our energy.

That is the reason why I stress my philosophy of going back to basics and adopting the "bottom up" approach rather than "top-down."

Back to basics means that we all listen intently to the heartbeat of Rotary, which is club service. Rotary's health, indeed. Rotary's survival depends on

this heartbeat – a life giving pulse of service that comes throughout our clubs, our workplaces, our communities, and our world.

Active club service leads to vital clubs with dedicated members. And active; club service thrives in an atmosphere committed in upholding Rotary's philosophy and the timeless principles that have made our fellowship strong. Among these principles I would include the rules governing membership recruitment, considerate and thorough assimilation of new members into our clubs, the ongoing education in Rotary for all members and the promotion of fellowship activities to strengthen the bonds of our clubs.

Going "back to basics" also means that we renew our commitment to vocational service. Many of us have forgotten that we were first invited into Rotary on the basis of our vocations, and that invitation carried with it a responsibility to represent our vocation to the club and to the community. And because membership in Rotary is based ;on vocations, it is of the utmost importance that we practice high ethical standards in our business and professional lives. We must practice what we preach to improve the general standards in members' respective vocations.

We have all witnessed the recent scandals in the business community – and the changes they have done. Unethical business practices topple corporation, destiny jobs, frighten investors and crumble economies worldwide.



Nov. 24, 1987 – Visit to RC San Fernando, La Union headed by then Pres. Ben Ang who gave me the governor's fund (P100/member then) as early as August long before my visit to help finance my club visitations. I was asked by Pres. Ben to have the President and Secretary Meeting in our house during breakfast time because I realized later, I was in for a surprise. At 9:00 AM, a twenty-five (25) car caravan with balloons was in the national highway as we were going out of my residence. This motorcade went around the plaza and then proceeded to the meeting place in Oasis Kris Room. I was introduced by the late PDG Rudy Nisce. He made it a tradition from then on,

while living, that the day after the governor's visit, he tendered breakfast at his residence. The club contributed \$7,100.00, the highest among all the clubs in the district. It also was the highest in % attendance at 87.33% for the year.

At the end of my Rotary Year, the most Outstanding Club in the entire district was no other than the RC of San Fernando, La Union because of its accomplishments and the number of attendees in all my District affairs except the host clubs. Second was the RC of Concepcion, Tarlac with 100% attendance in the club assembly with all in formal attire and with all their spouses during my address during my official visit.

My visits were also much remembered with a collection of \$70,518.37 for Rotary Foundation with \$24,581.63 in pledges which I was able to collect the following year. The most exciting was I stopped SMOKING during my term due to suspected throat cancer.

THE MOST EXCITING OFFICIAL VISITS DURING MY TERM AS DISTRICT GOV-ERNOR, RY 1987-1988

My term as Governor of the former District 379 started with 48 clubs and we organized five (5) more clubs with fifty-three (53) clubs.

My visits to clubs started in August 2, 1987 and ended on December 29, 1987 for the first 48 clubs. The five new clubs came later. My visits were all exciting and my spouse, Min, always joined me because I couldn't refuse the invitations of all presidents to bring my spouse with me. These will be long remembered. Then Dist. Sec. the late PP Flor de la Cruz, also joined me in almost all the clubs I visited. Welcome of the clubs were terrific. Sept. 8, 1987 - Visit to RC Metro Vigan
